West Belfast has multiple access points from Westlink and M1 motorways.

### TAXI

All seven Belfast Taxi CIC routes through West Belfastdepart from the King Street depot in the city centre.

### **BUS**

The new Translink Glider service departing City Centre travels along West Belfast's main arterial routes Falls Road, Andersonstown Road and Stewartstown Road until it reaches the Colin Transport Hub.

### BY FOOT

west Belfast is only a few minutes walk from Belfast City Centre. Exit from Castle Street, or Grosvenor Road to reach The Falls Road.



# **WEST BELFAST**






Cost | £10 per person | Free for citizens of Belfast

An award-winning modern, inspirational, visitor centre based in the heart of Belfast's Gaeltacht Quarter and located only yards from where James Connolly lived on the Falls Road. The centre offers a thought provoking insight into James Connolly's life, his politics and the impact he had on the history of the Island of Ireland.

The James Connolly Experience immerses you into the life and history of one of Ireland's greatest trade union and political leaders. Áras Uí Chonghaile's brand new audio tour guides you through the world class exhibition, to the unique library, Leabharlann Uí Chonghaile and through the art and historic collections.

Lasting approximately 40 minutes, the tour introduces you to many interactive features and historic artefacts including the RTÉ video archive, the Transatlantic Voyager and an original Irish Proclamation and the rare printing blocks the printed it.



# **Andersonstown Leisure Centre**

Cost | Family (2 Adults + 2 Children) £31.20 (Under 5s go Free)

Located on the Andersonstown Road, Andersonstown Leisure Centre Aqua Park boasts a surf simulator and one of the largest indoor aqua parks on the island.

Enjoy a fun-filled day out for all the fam-ily at the new aqua park which includes an adventure play area with water jets, slides, rope bridges and lots of family water fun.

The Little Lagoon is the perfect spot for toddlers to splash around and for the thrill seekers, the centre offers 3 world class high-speed water slides Torrent, Vortex and drop slide The Abyss






Surrounding the city lie the majestic Belfast Hills, where urban city life meets rural tranquility.

Resting in the heart of the Belfast Hills, Divis Mountain and Black Mountain provide a beautiful backdrop to the city's skyline. Explore this rich, varied archaeological landscape and discover how it is home to a host of wildlife. The walking trails through heath, on stone tracks, along boardwalks and road surface offer a diverse array of terrains to interest all walking levels. On a clear day, there are views of Strangford Lough, the Mourne and Sperrin mountain ranges and as far as Donegal and Scotland.

Located at the foot of the Belfast Hills connecting North and West Belfast is the picturesque Springfield Dam. Enjoy the tranquil surroundings of the large pond connected by a wooden bridge that overlooks an abundance of wildlife from swans, ducks and cormorant to heron and moorhens complete with pontoons attracting local angling fishermen.



Cultúrlann Mc Adam Ó Fiaich is Belfast's leading Irish language, arts and cultural centre located at the heart of West Belfast on the Falls Road.

Based in a former Presbyterian church, the building has had a number of incarnations during its often troubled history. As an arts centre, it is at the heart of the thriving Gaeltacht Quarter in Belfast.

An Cultúrlann houses An Ceathrú Póilí book and gift shop, West Belfast's tourist information point and Biá café and restaurant where visitors can enjoy a relaxed & homely atmosphere mixed with great

hearty food.

The Gaeltacht Experience welcomes visitors into a vibrant Irish language community giving you a taste of life in the Gaeltacht Quarter of Belfast. Perfect for large groups, the experience pro-vides a 3 course meal with live music throughout, a brief talk on the history of An Chultúrlann and the Gaeltacht Quarter, an Irish Language taster session, followed by a lively Céilí with Bean an Tí, Máire Uí Bhruadar.





### **Bog Meadows Nature Reserve**

Meandering its way from the mountains to the motorway lies the last surviving remnant of the extensive flood plain of the river Blackstaff covering 50 acres and comprises a mosaic of reedbeds, meadows, ponds, woodland streams and hedgerows.

During the Autumn months the Bog Meadow Nature Reserves, a variety of waders are attracted to the ponds when water levels are low. Winter is the best time to see the variety of ducks, geese and swans that overwinter here.

# St James' Community Farm

St James' Community Farm is a fantastic initiative led by volunteers and residents. The community farm has been in operation for over six years and has recently launched a new community hub.

The farm houses many farm animals including goats, sheep, ducks, chickens and many more.



Tucked away at the foot of the Belfast Hills is Colin Glen Forest Park, where your urban adventure awaits. Spread over two sites is a land of storytelling and a state-of-the-art sports park.

Enjoy beautiful scenery in what is affectionately known as Belfast's Green Lung. Walk with wildlife or zipline through the trees, follow Ireland's official Gruffalo Trail or take a heritage trail through an oasis of tranquillity.

Travel through the forest, twisting and turning while you control the speed on Ireland's First Alpine Coaster. Climb the 100ft tower and zip through the trees, at up to 50mph on Ireland's Longest Zipline, taking in the mind-blowing views over the city and valley of County Down!The new world class attractions are located at our Mountain Entrance in the 200-acre forest park with views over Belfast City and beyond.





# Féile na Carraige

13th - 22nd October

A week long festival of debates, reflection and heated discussion, tied in with top quality music, drama and sports.

The Féile programme of events prioritise the primary aims of the Féile: participation, politics and community. thus, the events and projects being showcased during the Féile aim to create space and encourage people to think critically and take control of their own destiny.

While Féile Na Carraige intends to challenge, inspire and involve asmany people as possible in a way that normalises a can-do culture of solidarity and collaboration, it also seeks to entertain and foster asense of enjoyment and craic.

The festival is embedded in the local area and gives a platform toyounger activists and transformative new community projects that have developed.

Féile An Phobail, Ireland's biggest community arts festival celebrate the ancient pagan tradition of Samhain.



# Roddy McCorley Republican Heritage Centre

Cost: £7 per person for museum admission

Discover the story of over 200 years of Irish Republicanism. A story told through the prism of a unique collection of locally gathered and curated historical artefacts from The Society of United Irishmen of 1798 through to the present day.

Located in the heart of west Belfast at the foot of the Belfast Hills, the new centre comprises of a world class museum, restaurant, bar and lounge and function and events space.

The impressive new Museum showcases a spectacular collection of artefacts and memorabilia as curated by the Roddy McCorley Society over the past 40 years. The collection charts the Republican struggle for independence dating back to the 1798 Rebellion, through the revolutionary period before and after 1916, right up to the Peace Process of the 1990s.

Cost | Free to visit


